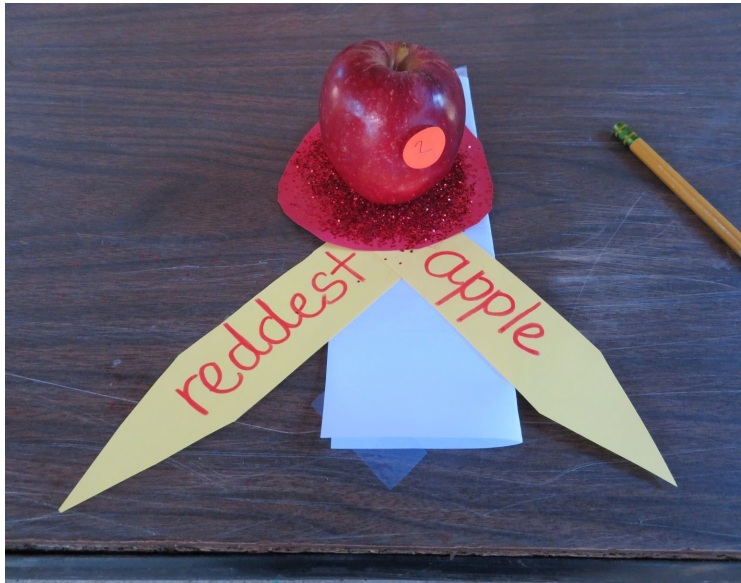

FIELD TRIPS & ENRICHMENT

Each year Shaw School plans field trips and enrichment activities. During the first part of the year, students from Decatur Island visited Shaw School. The students participated in team building activities at South Beach, including music with Anita. Later that fall, the Shaw School students traveled by water taxi to Decatur for its Annual Apple Day Festival. The students also joined Decatur School for an outdoor science experience with mushroom expert Lee Whitford. Shaw School students then expanded what they had learned about mushrooms into art projects.

Robotics instructor Randy Steele returned to Shaw School and worked with students programming EV3 robots and flying drones.

The students painted the Shaw General Store windows for the holiday season.

Even after school closures, Shaw School students were able to experience enrichment activities with visiting musicians from around the country via Zoom.



COVID-19 AND THE SCHOOL YEAR

Due to the world-wide COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Jay Inslee closed public schools from March 17, 2020 through April 24, 2020. By the beginning of April, he extended the closures for the remainder of the school year. Our dedicated teacher, Diane Clifton, anticipated the closures and began planning for remote learning in the beginning of March. The District began purchasing document cameras for students and lining up electronic devices and connectivity for all students. Due to Diane's forethought and planning, students were online learning by March 18th.

The learning curve for staff and students to participate in successful online sessions was immense, and there were many bumps in the road. Zoom was new to everyone. Delivering instruction remotely was a big change for our teacher and students who were used to hands-on, interactive learning. Schedules and protocols were tweaked. Students and families stepped up to the plate, and all students completed the school year meeting their grade level requirements.

Diane spent part of her summer in remote professional development classes, many focusing on distance learning. While the classes focused on teaching remotely, it was also valuable for Diane to experience online learning on the other side of the lens.

There were many challenges for all school districts throughout the country. Information on COVID-19 changed frequently as experts learned more about the virus. The Shaw Island School District prioritized the health of its students and staff and of the community at large as we all learned about masks and social distancing.
